General information and reading tips for the module catalog

About this module catalog:

A central component of the Bologna Process is the modularisation of the degree programs, i.e., the conversion of the previous course system to a module system in which the courses are bundled into thematically related course blocks - i.e., modules.

The module catalog to be generated contains the descriptions of all modules that have been integrated into the degree programme and successfully completed (without additional/voluntary achievements).

Important reading notes:

Topicality

It is recommended to generate the module catalog after each semester.

Legally binding

Legally binding information on all study- and examination-related questions can be found in the Subject Examination and Study Regulations (FPSOs) of the degree programs as well as the General Examination and Study Regulations of TUM (APSO).

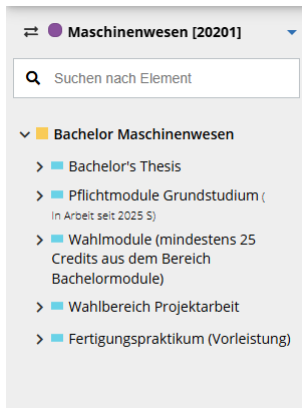
Elective modules


Elective modules are also generated, provided that they are assigned to the study tree and are successfully incorporated into the degree program (no additional/voluntary achievements).

Guide:

- Log in to your TUMonline account.
- In the area of Studies and Courses, select "My Studies".
- Select your degree program (select study program at top left).

- Select the “Download” icon at the top right .
- My Module Handbook (DE).
- Your Module Handbook is generated.
